Use:

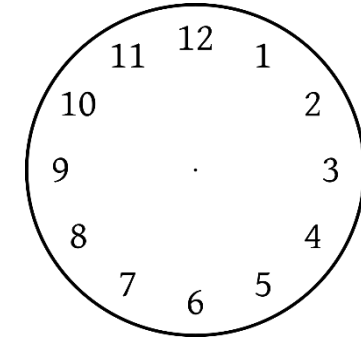
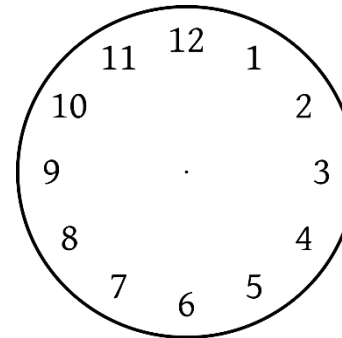
- *Time adverbs such as first, second, then, next, after and finally.*

- *Prepositions such as under, on, over, inside and outside.*
