

English

1. Watch this video on YouTube and follow the instructions to make your own paper aeroplane. <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=7KPaxKUDj6I> (take a photo and post on Dojo!)
2. Write the instructions to make a paper aeroplane, remember to use your 'bossy' verbs! Have a look at the bossy verbs you wrote last week, circle the ones you think would be useful for writing the instructions to making the paper aeroplane and use these in your writing.
3. Think about something you do everyday; for example, brushing your teeth, making your bed or getting dressed. Can you write the instructions for what you do? Make sure you write your instructions in the correct order.

Remember to use capital letters, finger spaces and full stops in your writing. Also, don't forget to use your 'Common Exception word mat'; to help you with the spelling of these words.

Maths

1. Get a square of paper. Try to fold it in half. Once you've done that, try to find half in a different way! How many different ways can you fold your paper in half? Below is an example of some of the ways we could think of – did you find more than us?
2. With a slice of bread, a sandwich or some toast, try to cut it in half. Half means two equal pieces! Then try to cut it into quarters. Quarters are four equal pieces. Once you have cut them, compare them to make sure you have made fair pieces!
3. See the shapes below that have been cut into halves and quarters. Try to colour a half, or a quarter of the shapes. You could print them off to do this, or draw with pencils, use chalk, paint, make them using playdough, draw them in the sand – what ever you like best!

Science

1. Earlier this year, we learnt about the four seasons. Can you make a list of them and describe the differences between them?
2. Take a look outside of your window, or go for a walk. What season do you think it is right now? How do you know? Tell an adult what you think and why.
3. What is your favourite season, and why? Draw a picture of yourself in that season and write a few sentences to describe the season.

1. There are many animal rights activists. One famous living activist is called Dr. Jane Goodall. Watch this video.

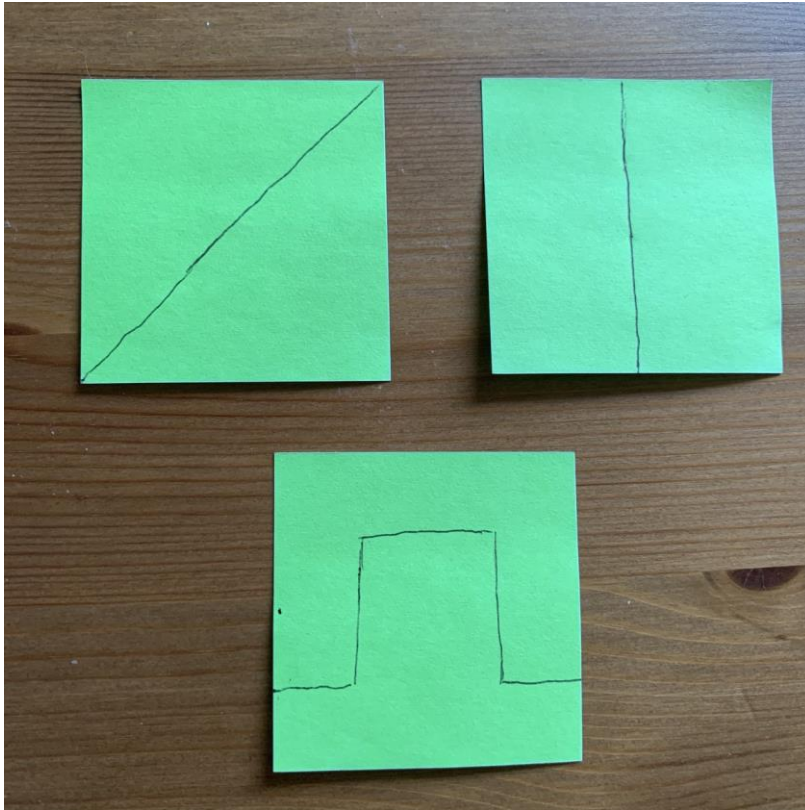
