



## Year 1 Home Learning Activities

### English

1. Before half term, you wrote a description of what you could see out of your window. What can you see now? What has changed? Remember to write descriptive sentences.
2. Now have a look out of another window where you live. What can you see out of this window? Which view do you prefer? Why?
3. Draw a picture of a window and draw an imaginary view. What will be in your picture? The seaside? Some toys? A swing? Animals? Once you have drawn your picture, write a description of what you can see. How do you think this view might change in the future?

Remember to use capital letters, finger spaces and full stops in your writing. Also, don't forget to use your 'Common Exception word mat'; to help you with the spelling of these words.

### Maths

1. We talk about multiplication as 'groups of.' Using cubes, lego, paint and paper, gems or anything you have in your house, try making: 2 groups of four. How many altogether? What if we swap them around, and have 4 groups of two. How many now? They have the same total! Investigate some other groups, and see if this always works.
2. Try some division, where we share into groups. To do this, host a picnic for your favourite toys! Share out some food (this could be real or pretend!) and see – if you have 4 teddies, and 20 grapes, how many grapes does each teddy get? Is it fair?
3. Try this game, where you have to share out the dog bones between the puppies! When you're finished, try talking about how many groups you have, how many bones are in each group, and if it is fair or unfair.

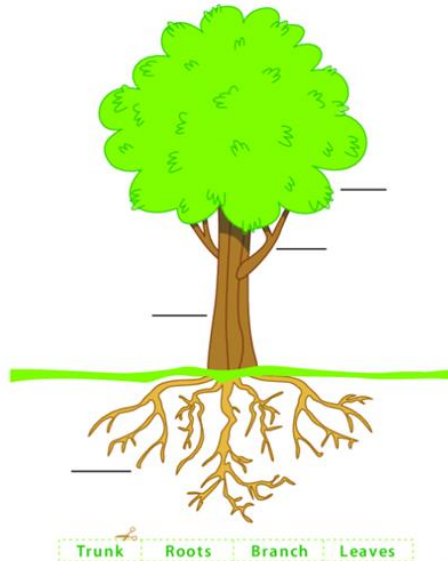
