E.g. "Please pick up your b—a—g, bag"</li> <li>Learn all set 1 speed sounds and the corresponding graphemes</li> <li>Learn to blend these sounds into words</li> <li>Recognise and read their own names and their friends' names.</li> <li>Share stories about starting school, our families, feelings, join in with stories with a repeated phrase and build our knowledge of a wide range of nursery rhymes</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Retell and create our own versions of: Twinkle Twinkle Little Star, Humpty Dumpty, Incy Wincy Spider</li> <li>Making marks and communicating meanings of different marks to friends when playing. E.g. sending a message to a friend, observing shapes in objects to make representations</li> <li>Investigating different pattern directions e.g. horizontal lines, circles, zigzags</li> <li>Learn how to write our names and sounds we have been taught using the correct formation of lower case letters</li> </ul>
