	ough the Mathematics Mastery programme, the children will be learning but numbers especially number to 10 Reception children will be singing number songs and rhymes to develop their reciting skills of numbers to 10 and beyond. Children will be number reciting in 2s, 10s and 5s and grouping objects in sets. Children will be reading numerals to 20 and learning how to form them with growing awareness of place value. Children will be doubling and halving numbers and solving problems. Exploring 2D and 3D shapes and building children's confidence in creating, describe patterns.	 Reception will continue to follow the RWI phonics scheme and learn to hear, recognise phonics sounds of the alphabet and blend phonemes to read. We will be reading cvc, ccvc and cvcc words, e.g. hot, step, huff. Many children will be learning to read new special friends in RWI set 2 sounds e.g. play, high, car, torch We will continue to learn to read by sight "tricky red" words e.g. "the, you, love, said, to, my, of, like, water, they, want, was, he, she." Our linked texts to our topic of "New Life" for Talk For Writing are, A poem called 5 Crispy Pancakes and a fact book about eggs and chicks. Our Author study is Hannah Lee. We will be reading books such as 'The Rapping Princess'. Further texts to support our topic include Martin Waddell's 'Farmer Duck' and 'Hungry Hen' by Richard Waring. 	 Reception children will be supported to write letters linking known sounds and communicating meanings of their writing E.g. writing about their models and artistic creations. We will continue to use our "Fred fingers" to segment green words to spell, e.g. bi-g = big We will continue to use the RWI pattern to learn how to form lower case letters correctly. We will try to position descender tails beneath the lines. In Talk 4 Writing, we will be learning how to write facts about chicks and writing our own poems.
