## School Uniform

Going to school, particularly an Infant one, is all about preparation. In the same ways that we ensure that children have all the key academic skills that are vital for them to **SOAR** we also place a strong emphasis on our Academy character, how we do things **TOGETHER**. With this underpinning value in mind the following uniform policy was created to:

- Be as simplistic as possible for families and the children
- Is best suited to allow our children to grow in independence
- Is the most cost effective and simplest to order
- Is smart and purposeful and corporately clear.

We demand that parents adhere closely to the school's uniform as set out clearly and comprehensively below. It is for the children to look smart; **TOGETHER**, but also for health and safety and to safeguard the children, which is especially important when on Educational Visits etc. which are a core element of our curriculum offer.

### Winter Uniform

- Grey trousers – boys or girls
- Grey skirts
- polo shirt (with school logo)
- grey tights
- Navy v neck sweatshirts/cardigans (with school logo)
- Plain socks



### Summer Uniform

(As above however with the following options)

- Grey Shorts (boys)
- Navy and white gingham summer dresses (girls)



### Footwear

Footwear should provide adequate safe cover to the feet and be easy for the children to take off and put on unaided therefore a Velcro fastening shoe is advised. Trainers, shoes with heels or sandals are unacceptable. Boots may not be worn in school; all children must wear school shoes. Shoes should be black. Shoes with gimmicks such as flashy lights and squeaking heels are strictly forbidden and will be removed from the child for parents to collect when convenient.

### P.E

Please provide the following items for P.E. They will need to be in a clearly labelled Navy P.E drawstring bag:

- White polo shirt (with school logo)
- Navy shorts or leggings
- Plimsolls / plain trainers

P.E kits will be sent home at least every half term. Please note the polo shirt is the same as the general uniform. This was a purposeful act to support parents and can be used as a backup in the case of messy/wet learning

### **Labelling uniform:**

#### **Permanent Pens and Laundry markers**

With 360 children all wearing the same uniform, lost items of clothing is a constant issue. Please label all uniform items with permanent pen. This will fade after a couple of washes though so continue to reapply. Parents have expressed better results with what is known as a 'laundry markers that can be purchased in many outlets and online via Amazon for instance.



#### **Iron-on labels**

You can purchase iron-on personalised labels (see right) via our Tesco's direct site. Ordering details are below.

#### **Jewellery**

No jewellery may be worn in school, other than stud earrings and items of particular and globally recognised religious significance. All jewellery will be removed for PE in compliance with Health and Safety guidance. Hoop earrings and those that cannot be removed should not be worn to school; earrings can get caught in equipment during P.E. or in the playground at break times and could cause an irreparable injury to a child's ear-lobe.

#### **Religious items of clothing**

Although often a contentious point the following clearly outlines for each of the main faiths are considered suitable clothing articles for children to wear.

There are key points that need to be taken into account in relation to our Academy:

- 1) We are an Infant Academy. Our children are Infants and generally come into Reception at the early stages of being able to dress themselves independently.
- 2) The EYFS curriculum has Physical Development interwoven though each subject area and therefore uniform needs to meet clear Health and safety guidance. It cannot impair their vision, must not be able to be caught on equipment; ultimately it must not increase the child's risk of harm be it from the equipment or through overheating.
- 3) Children need to be able to put on and take off any items on their own.

For further direction please contact the school. Any items worn must not contravene the above and must be in school colours: navy/white.
