

What is Lego Club?

Lego Club is a social development intervention that promotes a range of social skills. It is led by either a Teacher or Teaching Assistant.

It uses children's love of Lego play, as well as their strengths and interests, to develop communication and social skills.

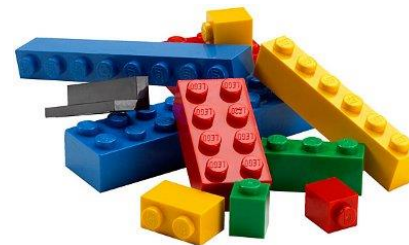


Lego Club can help with...

Sessions

There are 3 roles in Lego Club:

- The Engineer reads the instructions to the group.
- The Supplier finds the correct LEGO pieces.
- The Builder oversees building the model.

The roles rotate so children get the opportunity to try something new.

Although the intervention is child led, an adult will support throughout.
